Haverhill High is allowing incoming grade 9 students to opt out of the swim portion of the Freshman Physical Education class by passing a swim test at Haverhill High School's pool. Nettle students who are interested may take the test on Thursday, May 4. The test will start at 3:15 and be completed by 4:15. Students must be able to swim the width of the pool (@12 yards); crawl stroke, backstroke, breaststroke, side stroke, elementary backstroke, and show that they can swim under water for at least six yards (@ half the width of the pool) and tread water for one minute. From Math Specialist

We all know that reading with a child helps literacy skills, and that playing sports in the backyard teaches the value of teamwork and being physically active. But where are the life lessons for mathematics? The truth is that we all use mathematics many times each day, but often don't realize

it. From trips to the grocery store to the amount of time playing video games, math is part of our daily lives. Don't underestimate your own math skills. You can help your child learn math! You can support your child by helping them understand how math plays a role in everyday activities. Find ways to incorporate math into everyday activities at home, for example, making goals to save money, calculating discounts, or predicting the time it will take to get to Walmart. Grocery stores are a great source of math lessons. For example, you can talk aloud about how to weigh fruit on a scale or how to estimate the total cost of groceries as you fill your cart. Do informal math together. And on rainy days, family evenings and vacation time, play math games such as Yahtzee, Dominoes or Connect Four. Show your child that math is fun!

ELA classes are finishing up their novel studies! Please ask your child what they've been reading and have some discussions! The more students talk about what they are reading, the better the comprehension. We also finished up an MCAS practice this week for grades 7 and 8. We are also working hard at implementing Writing with Colors which is a strategy to help students organize their writing. As usual, please continue to encourage students to read.
