One of our 7th grade students is representing Haverhill baseball in a tournament in Cooperstown. The team is doing a Sneaker Fundraiser in the Haverhill Middle Schools. Please donate any gently used or new Sneakers to this cause. There is a box in the office to drop them off.

Haverhill High is allowing incoming grade 9 students to opt out of the swim portion of the Freshman Physical Education class by passing a swim test at Haverhill High School's pool. Nettle students who are interested may take the test on **Thursday, May 4**. The test will start at 3:15 and be completed by 4:15. Students must be able to swim the width of the pool (@12 yards); crawl stroke, backstroke, breaststroke, side stroke, elementary backstroke, and show that they can swim under water for at least six yards (@ half the width of the pool) and tread water for one minute. From Math Specialist

Students in the upper grades are working on percentages and lower grades are learning ratios and equivalent fractions. Any opportunity that you have to give your student a real life example of a percentage (10% discount - estimate the new price), ratio (for every one cup of milk add two cups of cereal) or fractions (which is bigger $\frac{3}{4}$ of a cup or $\frac{1}{2}$ of a cup) helps them visualize the concept in class.

From Reading Specialist

Ask your student what they are learning about realistic fiction. Have them practice retelling a story in chronological order. Being able to tell the story is critical to writing a story.

Realistic Fiction: a writing genre comprised of a made up story that sounds like it could have happened

We've answered some common queries below:

How do I create my account?

Just click on the 'Create your account' button above and then follow the steps shown on screen.

What can I do with Qustodio?

You can view your child's activity on their school devices, read digital safety guidance from experts, and remotely switch off the internet using the 'Pause' button during hours designated by your district.

Do I need to configure Qustodio on my child's school device to turn on protection?

No, your child's device is already protected. By setting up your account with Qustodio, you aren't turning protection on or off. Your new account provides you with visibility of your child's activity on their school device.

Do I need to pay anything?

It is completely free to create your account and get visibility on your child's school devices. You can also get visibility on two family devices for free - with the option of adding Premium features.

How does Qustodio use my child's data?

Qustodio is COPPA compliant and does not share personal data with third parties.
