Let's have another look at Black History Month because "Knowing the past, opens the door to the future" *as stated in the National Museum of Aftican American History.* This years theme is African Americans and the Arts according to ASALH. Consider reading some poems by Amanda Gorman <u>Amanda Gorman</u>, an African American poet, *cum laude* graduate of Havard University and youngest inaugural poet in US history. Reflect on her line from the poem *The Hill We Climb:*

We will not march back to what was, but move to what shall be: a country that is bruised but whole, benevolent but bold, fierce and free... (Amanda Gorman) Another option for older students is the movie *Malcom X* directed by Spike Lee and staring Denzel Washington. The movie is rated PG-13 so it may not be appropriate for all students.

February 7- February 14 is Congenital Heart Defect Awareness week. The staff at Nettle will be wearing red (or some red) each day during the week to show support for children everywhere born with this rare condition (and to support a faculty member for whom this is a personal cause). We are encouraging students to join us in raising awareness for this issue.
