Happy Fall Everyone!

The MCAS scores were released this week and we are very proud of our students' efforts! Although our achievement wasn't what we had hoped for, we had amazing growth in some areas:

- Our percentage of 5th and 8th students Meeting or Exceeding the Science Standards increased by 11%.
- Our Chronic Attendance rate has decreased by 11% this year (and last year), over 20 percentage points in 2 years.
- Our Accountability score (think of it as a state-wide ranking) has increased over the last 3 years from 5th percentile (2021) to 12th percentile (2022) to the 19th percentile (2023).
- 5th grade ELA Achievement scores improved by 4% while growth in grades 6,7 and 8 all exceeded the State.
- Our Growth and Achievement scores in Math improved in all grades with over 60% growth in grade 7.
- Our progress towards our State-assigned targets was in the 72nd percentile we have made "substantial progress" toward our targets according to Department of Elementary and Secondary Education. Here is a <u>link</u> to our school profile.

Our goals this year include continuing to lower our Chronic Attendance rate, increase our students' academic achievement, increase parent and family engagement as we evolve into a Community School, and increase our use of restorative justice practices to improve equitable access for all students to the curriculum.
